## Leeds-based charity Canopy takes a novel approach to the housing shortage: derelict properties for the homeless are renovated by the homeless

Homes lie empty and derelict in Hyde Park, Beeston and Harehills – no-go areas in [Leeds](#) as far as private sector developers are concerned, even those that claim to be in the business of regeneration. But one group is as busy as ever.

Canopy is a community housing project that has made these areas its stamping ground by renovating derelict property for the homeless.

It is also a self-help project – those seeking housing must work on the renovation before they become tenants.

Canopy was formed in 1996 – just as the housing market and economy started to soar – and has since restored 36 former council houses, largely through the efforts of volunteers as well as the homeless.

This may seem a paltry tally when measured against the output of even a small private housebuilder. But Canopy represents true grass-roots endeavour – painstaking work that owes nothing to market forces. And with a commitment to affordable rents – £90 a week for a four-bedroom house – there is neither the money nor ambition to have it any other way.

'We want to keep the DNA of Canopy, which is creating small community networks, renovating
